- Copy of your Permanent Resident Card in Australia or other category of visa.
- Photocopy of your fiancé(e)'s Philippine passport.
- Certified true copy of your Philippine passport.
- PSA Birth Certificate (Apostilled by DFA)
- Any of these documents depending on your civil status.
 - If you are single, Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Certificate of No Marriage Record (apostilled by DFA)
 - If you were previously married and annulled, either PSA amended marriage certificate (apostilled by DFA) or Philippine Court's Certificate of Finality (authenticated by DFA)
 - If you were previously married and divorced, either PSA amended marriage certificate, apostilled by DFA or Philippine Court's Certificate of Finality, apostilled by DFA
 - If you are a widow or widower, PSA Death Certificate of deceased spouse, apostilled by DFA
- If you are age 18-20 years old, Affidavit of Parental Consent, notarized by a notary public where the signing parent resides
- If you are age 21-25 years old, Affidavit of Parental Advice (DFA-apostilled)
- Consular fee of AUD45.00. Payable by cash, postal money order and/or bank cheque payable to the Philippine Embassy
- Returned express prepaid envelope large size with return address
